CHEF'S CORNER: CAJUN CHICKEN

Cajun-style grilled chicken breasts for varied meals, such as Caesar salad, sandwiches, and a dinner entree! Cajun Chicken can be served hot or cold.

Ingredients

- 2 cups vegetable oil
- 2 tablespoons Cajun seasoning
- 2 tablespoons dried Italian-style seasoning
- Garlic powder to taste
- 2 tablespoons lemon pepper
- 10 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves, pounded to 1/2 inch thickness

Directions

1. In a shallow dish, mix the oil, Cajun seasoning, Italian seasoning, garlic powder, and lemon pepper. Place the chicken in the dish and turn to



coat with the mixture. Cover, and refrigerate for 1/2 hour.

2. Preheat the grill for high heat.

3. Lightly oil the grill grate. Drain chicken and discard marinade. Place chicken on hot grill and cook for 6 - 8 minutes on each side, or until juices run clear.

2ND ANNUAL RAY'S RUN



FAOIAM hosted its second annual Ray's Run 5K at Methodist University on Saturday, October 8th. Approximately 50 walkers and runners gathered, prayed, and made their way through the

school's campus on either a 3.1 mile course or 1 mile fun run. Those who opted to participate virtually walked or ran on their own and submitted their distance and time.

Ray's Run is held in memory of Col. (R) Ray Helton, FAOIAM's former Executive Director and visionary for The Lodge. Ray's Run 5K will provide needed upgrades to the kitchen facility which can house up to 40 men. Between sponsorships and race registrations, FAOIAM raised over \$11,000 toward the \$25,000 goal to make the upgrades.








WOULD YOU LIKE TO BE PART OF A MEAL TEAM, BUT CAN'T MAKE BREAKFAST?
